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

The Projects

In early 2023, we invited NGOs to submit their applications that align with our mission of fostering collaboration for social and environmental sustainability in Hong Kong. Our criteria emphasised the importance of partnership, requiring that each application include at least two collaborating organisations.

We received an overwhelming response, with over 50 applications submitted for consideration. Each proposal was reviewed and scored by our advisory board. Following this, the top eight projects were selected for indepth discussion during our board meeting. The selection of the top three projects were announced at ReThink HK 2023. We are proud to show you the impact they have created over the past year. These initiatives exemplify the spirit of collaboration and innovation that we strive to promote in our community.

Humanity Seekers Cooking for More Good

Cooking for Change: Empowering Refugees and Combating Food Insecurity in Hong Kong.

Vision of Project

"Refugees Cooking for More Good" was launched by Humanity Seekers, Justice Centre and More Good aiming to empower refugees and tackle food insecurity in Hong Kong. By engaging refugees in community service, the project fosters purpose and promotes social development while bridging communities.



Objectives

- To empower refugees to engage actively with society through volunteerism.
- To alleviate food insecurity by providing nutritious meals to vulnerable communities.

Refugees in Hong Kong often face social marginalization and exclusion, coupled with limited access to employment. Simultaneously, food insecurity remains a critical issue for low-income families and other vulnerable groups. This project, running from January to August 2024 with funding and support from the ReThink Foundation, addressed these dual challenges.

The ReThink Foundation provided vital funding to execute a range of impactful activities, significantly benefiting key stakeholders.

Meal Preparation & Distribution:

Refugee volunteers prepared and distributed 2,475 nutritious meals to vulnerable groups, including the elderly and low-income families.

Training Programs:

Participants received training on sustainable cooking practices, equipping them with valuable skills for personal development.

Volunteer Empowerment:

Refugees gained meaningful roles through structured volunteering, enhancing their sense of purpose and community integration.

Amplifying Impact Through Collaborative Power

The collaboration between Justice Centre, Humanity Seekers and More Good was a critical factor in the success of the "Refugees Cooking project. This partnership for More Good" leveraged the strengths and resources of both achieve the project's objectives NGOs to effectively. Justice Centre and Humanity Seekers brought their extensive experience in working with refugees, while More Good contributed its expertise in the Food & Beverage industry, including access to chef-grade kitchen space and food safety education.





The partnership facilitated efficient coordination, resource sharing, and mutual support, which were essential for the project's implementation. This successful collaboration demonstrated the power of strategic partnerships in addressing complex social issues and highlighted the importance of working together to amplify impact.

PEACE: A NEW LITERACY

Cultivating a New Literacy in Hong Kong Secondary Schools: Peace Education

Vision of the Project

Peace: A New Literacy was a project created by Peace Generation and the Hong Kong Association of the Heads of Secondary Schools (HKAHSS), proposing the cultivation of a new literacy: peace, in addition to writing, reading and speaking. Peace education involves teaching this new literacy, which includes knowledge and awareness of the threats of violence and strategies for peace, and insights into how to transform a culture of violence into a peaceful one. This initiative aimed to address the needs of both the students and the school community in terms of intrapersonal and interpersonal peace.

Objectives

(a) To enable students to develop the ability to resolve and transform their personal conflict

(b) To empower the students to promote peace in their school community.



Conflict often has a detrimental effect on students' well-being when it is mishandled or left unresolved, leaving students' emotions unaddressed and ignored over time. This can result in a buildup of unresolved tension and potentially escalate conflicts in the future, worsening the negative impacts on students' wellbeing. In response to this concern, Peace: A New Literacy was carried out from September 2023 to April 2024 with the funding from the ReThink Foundation.



Project Description

The ReThink Foundation funding provided was instrumental in carrying out the wide range of project activities, and creating such an impact on key stakeholders.

Developed a peace education curriculum

Development of a "Peace by Piece" curriculum which outlined five elements for a series of conflict handling workshops, namely perspectives, empathy, actors, context and empowerment.

Recruited and trained facilitators and volunteers

The project recruited 6 facilitators, in which they deepened their understanding of conflict and peace along with providing invaluable insights to improve the curriculum.

Conducted workshops for students in the target school and pilot test curriculum

A total of 58 students from Secondary 3 to Secondary 5 were enrolled in the Peace by Piece workshops. Students were divided into 5 groups to participate in 6 sessions of interactive workshops, where they learnt essential knowledge and practical skills to identify, handle, and transform everyday conflicts.

Empowered student mini-peace projects

Students also worked in groups to identify a conflict in school and designed an action plan based on their analysis. Through these minipeace projects, students have consolidated their learnings and formulated preliminary ideas to actualize positive change in school.

Amplifying Impact Through Collaborative Power

- ReThink Foundation's partnerships-driven model inspired a fruitful collaboration between Peace Generation and HKAHSS. The Peace by Piece curriculum was successfully curated as a result of the synergy between Peace Generation's vision of sustainable peace, and HKAHSS' valuable contextual information on the specific needs and interests of students and teachers in Hong Kong.
- The organisations' cross-collaborative efforts allowed for a such a successful program, where drawing from each other's expertise was instrumental in bringing peace education to Hong Kong students.



"I can now identify the genuine needs behind the positions of conflict parties. I used to think conflicts were complicated but didn't realise the similar needs of opposing parties. We may transform conflicts into peaceful relationships by addressing the needs of both sides." "I've learnt to think outside the box. There may be better and more creative ways to handle conflicts besides quick fixes. Through the pirate role play, I understand that we all have different perspectives and interpretations on the same subject."



Conclusion

Currently, peace education remains a relatively small movement in Hong Kong. While this project is a preliminary endeavour, the positive outcomes achieved thus far have demonstrated the potential of peace education. Its future development will rely on the exploration by educators, policymakers, parents, students and the community.

Cultivating Empathy and Resilience Through Unique Experiences

Vision Statement from Founder

Cultivating Empathy and Resilience Through Unique Experiences.

Mission & Values

Running in the Dark and Runnerful aimed to cultivate empathy and encourage students to cherish life, face difficulties with resilience, and harness positive energy. The project conducted 8 school seminars and 4 experience classes within the year to achieve their vision.

Problem Addressed

The project focused on raising awareness and empathy for the visually impaired. This was achieved through carefully managed seminars and experience classes, where volunteer training ensured student safety during large events. Many students grow up unaware of the struggles faced by the visually impaired, highlighting the need for such initiatives. The primary audience was society and students, aiming to create a more empathetic and supportive community. By increasing awareness and empathy towards the visually impaired, the project fostered a more inclusive community environment.

Key Wins and Learnings

As a result of the support from ReThink HK, the project attracted more schools than anticipated. Feedback from participants highlighted the critical role of education in promoting empathy, motivating an expansion of efforts. The seminars and experience classes significantly increased students' understanding of the challenges faced by visually impaired individuals. As a result, participants reported enhanced positivity and determination to assist others.

The project successfully completed its target of 8 seminars and 4 experience classes ahead of schedule, reaching over 2,000 students. Success was measured not only by the number of students reached but also by the values instilled in them, fostering empathy and societal contribution.

Positive Impact on Stakeholders

Visually Impaired Individuals:

- Gained increased independence and accessibility in daily life.
- Experienced a greater sense of inclusion and support within the community.

Students:

- Developed a deeper empathy and practical skills to support visually impaired individuals.
- Gained a sense of purpose and fulfilment from making a positive difference.

Educational Institutions:

• Enhanced their reputation as institutions prioritizing social responsibility and community engagement.

Future Impact

Empowered Students as Advocates:

The knowledge and empathy gained by students will carry into their future endeavours, enabling them to advocate for accessibility and inclusion effectively.

Strengthened Community Partnerships:

The project forged valuable partnerships between educational institutions and organisations serving the visually impaired. Such collaborations are crucial for bringing value to the community, serving as a model for future initiatives that address issues like lack of empathy. Schools are particularly effective partners, as they allow targeting children at a very impressionable age, maximizing the long-term impact of educational efforts.

Influence on Future Projects:

The expansion and scalability of the project were made possible by adequate funding, allowing greater engagement with students and visually impaired individuals. This success paves the way for future initiatives focused on building empathy and understanding in society.







Capacity Building Programme

Empowering NGOs Through Humans Matter Workshops

In our commitment to nurturing resilient and effective nongovernmental organisations, the ReThink Foundation recognises that financial support, while crucial, is not sufficient to ensure the longterm success and impact of these vital entities. Equally important is the provision of capacity building programs that empower NGO staff with the skills, knowledge, and tools necessary to maximise their effectiveness and sustainability.

The Importance of Capacity Building

Capacity building programs go beyond financial aid to address the foundational aspects of organisational development and effectiveness. By strengthening the capabilities of NGO leaders and teams, these programs enable organisations to better manage resources, implement projects, and achieve their mission. This holistic approach ensures that NGOs are not just supported but are also more adaptable, innovative, and impactful in their operations.

Humans Matter Workshops for ReThink Foundation NGO Grantees

Humans Matter facilitated a series of transformative workshops for the ReThink Foundation NGO grantees, each designed to enhance specific capabilities that are crucial for effective leadership and organisational management.



September Workshop: The Ability to Act Model


The first workshop introduced the "Ability to Act Model," focusing on cultivating personal initiative and self-efficacy among NGO leaders. This model emphasises the importance of individuals taking proactive steps to achieve goals through effective interaction with their environment and others. By enhancing self-efficacy and agency, leaders are better equipped to initiate and execute actions that drive their organisations forward.

October Workshop: Future-Back Strategy Planning

The October session utilised a "Future-Back" approach to strategy and goal planning. This method helps participants overcome common biases by envisioning their successful future state first and then planning backwards to the present. This reverse engineering of the path to success enables leaders to set inspiring goals while pre-emptively addressing potential challenges, thereby fostering a bold and innovative approach to their organisational strategies.

In February, the focus shifted to enhancing interpersonal effectiveness through an understanding of DiSC assessment frameworks and sociodynamics. This workshop provided NGO leaders with tools to map out leadership and work styles within their teams, identifying preferences and strategies for more effective collaboration. By understanding the diverse behavioural tendencies of their stakeholders, leaders can foster a more inclusive and productive organisational culture.
